In his capacity as the Director of OSF, Mr. Russell staffs the School Safety Infrastructure Council, established by the state legislature to develop and implement school safety standards, using an all-hazards approach to safety and security. He also serves as staff to the School Building Planning Advisory Council, the Governor-appointed body established to develop more efficient and cost effective means for the development and administration of school construction projects. Mr. Russell has more than 16 years of experience in residential, commercial, and institutional development, including administering an urban housing and neighborhood revitalization program, developing more than 120 residential units, managing the acquisition and disposition of 50-plus properties for multiple municipal departments, and managing a \$40 million school construction project that was the first LEED Gold certified school in Connecticut.
